The core premise guiding each is the belief that all people share a common humanity and have a right to equitable treatment, support for their human rights, and a fair allocation of community resources.

Closing the gap in health disparities. Opening the door to a new culture of care

Equality Health's innovative approach to providing healthcare stems from years of research on the impact of health disparities among the Latino population and the continual struggle to achieve health equality with limited healthcare resources.

Witnessing challenges with language, cultural understanding, social determinants, addiction, health literacy, and sustainable engagement led us to create of a cultural care network of like-minded Hispanic physicians. What started as a group of nine primary care physicians in 2015, has grown into a network of more than 1,000 providers in Arizona.

"We work relentlessly to do our part. Our deepest sense of inspiration has come from working directly with patients and independent physicians in the community." – Hugh Lytle, Founder, Chairman & CEO

This unprecedented growth was due, in part, to Equality Health's investment in a deep data analysis of Maricopa County's most underserved areas. Looking at community factors like access to public transportation and availability of healthcare providers, Equality Health was able to target key locations to build Complex Care Centers that house primary care, behavioral health, and social support services. In addition, the company created the first patient whole health assessment that takes into account not just health risks, but social and cultural factors.

The app that helps close the gap

Another way Equality Health is closing the gap in health disparities is by offering the first culturally-enabled mobile engagement application for smart phones. The innovative platform provides easy access to bilingual care coordinators with concierge-level service that gives patients the ability to:

- · Schedule an office visit or a virtual telemedicine visit
- Request to "chat" with doctors, pharmacists, and eventually, behavioral health specialists
- · Access information to improve health care literacy
- Learn what community resources are available and relevant to their needs
- Connect to diabetes, maternity, asthma, high cholesterol, high blood pressure, behavioral health, and pharmacy adherence services

A universal vision that keeps expanding

Equality Health is targeting other innovations around cultural wellness programs, diabetes education, pain and addiction treatment, and patient self-management tools. The vision of Equality Health is two-fold: to prove that a culturally focused delivery system can produce better outcomes and higher patient satisfaction—and then scale and replicate this costefficient model across other minority communities nationwide.

At its core, Equality Health exists to end health disparities and improve the health of individuals, families, and communities.



How we do it

Through an integrated population health technology and community platform, culturally competent physician network, and community partnerships, Equality Health helps managed care plans and health systems improve care for undeserved populations, while simultaneously making the transition to risk-based accountability.

Where we started

Equality Health began its pursuit of better healthcare for all by analyzing community-based data from Maricopa County's most undeserved areas. These disparities drove us to develop a proprietary Cultural Care Model.

Looking at factors like population trends, food insecurities, transportation, education, employment, and access to care allowed Equality Health to target key hotspots for community interventions, provider network design, and complex care centers that will house primary care, behavioral health and social support services—all specifically tailored to better serve the community.

This holistic, technology-enabled approach increases health literacy, integrates physical and behavioral health with primary care, and creates an alignment with community based organizations to close gaps in care and solve for social determinants of health.
