

Hon. Elizabeth Naa Kwatsoe Tawiah Sackey Greater Accra Deputy Regional Minister

Born in Tamale, Ghana, the Hon. Elizabeth K.T. Sackey, hails from the Asene Clan in the Greater Accra Region. Elizabeth is a polyglot, conversant in five languages including Ga, Twi and Hausa.

Elizabeth Sackey is a proud graduate of Accra High School and the University of Ghana, with a BSc in Public Administration. She is also an economist and certificate holder in Marketing. Mrs. Sackey was also employed at Ghana Commercial Bank, over a 22-year period, where she served as Chief Clerk, prior to becoming a Member of Parliament.

Following her banking career, she served as a member of the AMA District Assembly for Akweteman Electoral Area in the Okaikwei North Constituency and eventually rose to become a Member of Parliament, for 12 years.

She was first elected to the position in 2004, and later won 2008 and 2012 parliamentary elections on the New Patriotic Party (NPP) ticket. Her rich experience, love and dedication for the NPP party, and for Ghana, led H. E. Nana Addo Dankwa Akuffo Addo to appoint her as the current Deputy Regional Minister for Greater Accra.

She has also served as:

- Chairman of the Greater Accra NPP Members of Parliament Caucus, Greater Accra Region Campaign Member (NPP 2016).
- As a Ghanaian representative to the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS).

- The First Secretary General for ECOWAS's Female Parliamentary Association (ECOFEPA).
- Organizing Member for NPP National Thanksgiving Service, 2016.
- The first woman in the history of Okaikwei North to win the District Assembly, and the first to win the Parliamentary seat for three terms.

Under her leadership, the initiative has developed from a project idea to an award-winning social enterprise that has won several international awards.

Ms. Dapaah is a prolific young woman popularly known for her insatiable innovative drive in social entrepreneurship. She has recently been crowned with the prestigious CEO Business Award by the Africa Aurora Business Network (AABN), has been a long-time Young Global Leader of the World Economic Forum, and is an alumna of Harvard University's Executive Education Program.

She holds a Diploma in Human Resource Management and Marketing from the Institute of Commercial Management UK and a bachelor's degree in Business Administration from the Christian Service University College, in Kumasi. She has more than a decade of work experience in both the for-profit and non-profit industries. Bernice is a member of the World Economic Forum Global Agenda Council on Biodiversity and Natural Capital, made up of the world's foremost intellectual network, convening the most relevant and knowledgeable thought leaders from business, government, academia and civil society to address key global issues.

She was named as an Ambassador of the World Bamboo Organization, having also been appointed as a member of the prestigious Global Teacher Prize Academy. In addition, she has been honored with the World Entrepreneurship Forum's "Entrepreneur for the World Award" for her impact on society and capacity to change the world. \square
