OVERVIEW

Acres for America, one of the most effective public-private partnerships in the history of U.S. conservation efforts, announced \$3.8 million in grants to protect and connect wildlife habitat across more than 100,000 acres in California, Hawaii, Michigan, Minnesota, Montana, North Carolina and Texas. These grants will leverage an additional \$81.2 million in matching contributions, pushing the total conservation investment to more than \$85 million.

Acres for America is NFWF's premier land conservation program. Since 2005, NFWF and Walmart have been supporting the conservation of critical habitats for birds, fish, plants and wildlife; connecting existing protected lands to unify wild places and protect migration routes; providing access for people to enjoy the outdoors; and ensuring the future of local economies that depend on forestry, ranching and recreation.

Acres for America 2017 Grant Slate

Since its inception, Acres for America has funded 81 projects in 35 states, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico to permanently protect more than 1.3 million acres — far surpassing its original goal of 100,000 acres — and connecting over 10 million acres.

The program's priorities include the following:

- Conserve critical habitats for birds, fish, plants and wildlife
- Connect existing protected lands to unify wild places and protect migration routes
- Provide access for people to enjoy the outdoors
- Ensure the future of local economies that depend on forestry, ranching and recreation

Acquisition of the Waimea

The Trust for Public Land will help acquire the rugged

of Oahu, Hawaii to complete the protection of the entire Waimea watershed from mountaintop to ocean. The project will secure suitable habitat for rare birds, including the Newell's shearwater and the Oahu elepaio, along with numerous other threatened and endangered wildlife and plant species. The forest will also protect the headwaters of two major streams which flow directly to Waimea Bay and the Humpback Whale National Marine Sanctuary.

Conservation Easement on Mailliard Ranch for the Protection of Redwood Forests in Northern California (CA)
Grantee: Save the Redwoods League
Grant Amount: \$250,000
Matching Funds: \$26,750,000
Total Amount:\$27,000,000
Save the Redwoods League will help place a conservation
easement on the 14,898-acre Mailliard Ranch working
forest. The grant will help conserve high-quality redwood,
oak woodland and riparian forests, including 1,000 acres
of old-growth redwoods. The ranch also hosts 28 miles
of streams that provide habitat for migrating salmon and

steelhead, and will connect with another 82,000 acres of contiguous protected lands.

Texas A&M Forest Service will restore and protect a portion
of Longleaf Ridge connecting the Angelina and Sabine
National Forests north of Beaumont. The project will use a
conservation easement to permanently protect 5,500 acres

of managed timberland containing longleaf pine woodlands, beech slope forests, spring-fed creeks, pitcher plant bogs and other rare plant species.
